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5D Baccalaureate

Using our bespoke skills framework TENSILE, we will develop your child's transferable skills. These will become more important as your child moves through school and into the world of work, whether this is after further education, higher education or an apprenticeship route. To support in the development of TENSILE we have devised a range of Ambition Projects. Each subject team has written their own project that fits into a specific area of their curriculum to deepen the learning already taking place within the classroom. Each project will help your child to look at subject specific skills and research techniques, as well as helping them form their own opinions based on their research. Your child will have the opportunity to present their project in their teaching groups for immediate feedback and recognition. The 5D Baccalaureate credits students with the work they do outside of the classroom alongside the fantastic attitudes to learning they develop in their lessons.



Curriculum (TENSILE)

Our ASK framework clearly expresses our priorities in relation to the development of *Attitudes*, *Skills* and *Knowledge*. The three core *Attitudes* we encourage and develop are being kind, being respectful and working hard. We explicitly teach these values through our SBE Behaviour Curriculum. The *Skills* of ASK are named TENSILE, a word which means 'capable of being stretched' and a way in which we challenge and support our students in developing the transferable skills required within and beyond school. These skills are Teamwork, Expression, Numeracy, Solving Problems, Independence, Literacy and Enquiry. The *Knowledge* of ASK is the learning that we have identified as critical for success and unique to each subject.



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Extra-Curricular

We strongly encourage students to participate in clubs after school. All of our clubs are free and they are extremely varied: sports, games, drama, music, art, Duke of Edinburgh Award, homework, school newspaper, school broadcast and many more. Research has shown that students who regularly participate in extra-curricular activities improve their attainment at Key Stage 3 and GCSE; it also shows an improved attitude and attendance at school. Our extra-curricular provision is very strong at SBE and has been recognised as such by Ofsted.



PE facilities and Basketball

We have three sports halls, a brand new astroturf pitch, 4 tennis courts, a gym and large playing fields. We are very proud of our sporting achievements and SBE teams have a strong track record of success in Local and National Competitions. Our Basketball Academy is run by experienced and enthusiastic coaches; our coaches work with both the Junior and Senior Teams alongside encouraging wider participation in basketball from the rest of our community. Our Senior Basketball Team has an amazing record and has been promoted to the top division of national school basketball. Our Basketball players not only have incredible skills, but play a critical part in being great role models, working with our younger students, helping Year 7 students with reading, for example.

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Transition

At SBE , we know how daunting joining a secondary school can feel. We work closely with our primary schools to ensure that each Year 7 has the best possible start to SBE. A group of teachers, including some of the senior team and the pastoral team, visit each primary school separately to talk to them about what to expect, but also to ensure that Year 6 students have a chance to ask questions the school. In the summer term we welcome all new Year 7 students to SBE to meet their form tutors, spending the day experiencing what life at SBE is like.



Music and Arts

We strongly value the arts at Shenley Brook End School. Our music provision is second to none in Milton Keynes. We have a large number of music ensembles, some of which are now led by our enthusiastic student leaders. Our Musicals have been exceptional, exemplifying all that our students learn and the dedication of our teaching teams in art, music and drama. Our recent productions of Oliver and High School Musical were brilliant. At KS3 students study art, music and drama throughout the year; alongside our commitment to arts in the curriculum, we also offer all of our Year 7 students the opportunity to achieve the Bronze Arts Award.



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Sixth Form

Our Sixth Form is extremely popular with students and has an excellent track record of academic success. We offer a range of different courses and our offer reflects our commitment to the arts and to languages, being both rich and varied. Our Sixth Formers benefit from dedicated Sixth Form facilities including: a separate sixth form study centre, access to Chrome Books, a Sixth Form Library and a Café. Our Sixth Form frequently has students going on to a range of prestigious destinations, including Oxford, Cambridge, Russell Group Universities and some extremely competitive apprenticeships. Our Sixth Formers work closely with the lower school as mentors and support – we feel very proud of our sixth formers, and our Sixth Form.
