Due to the school's oversubscription and academic record, we have completed a new building programme to expand the school. We have excellent specialist facilities including computing rooms, music practice areas, science laboratories, specialist DT and food rooms, classrooms, two sports halls and a gym, well-resourced main school and sixth form libraries, many dining and social areas including our restaurant and cafés and a large improved theatre. This is a fantastic learning environment for all our students.





In order to support young people in preparation for adult life we look well beyond examination results whilst having high expectations that all students should fulfil their academic potential.

We focus on developing the **Attitudes, Skills and Knowledge** that grow confident and independently thinking young people who are ready to learn and embrace challenges and opportunities well beyond their time with us at school.

Exploring learning both inside and outside school is key in nurturing student reflection to enable them to develop ideas and make links.





We are a large and growing school which is a welcoming place where students are known and nurtured. Our five houses bring students from all year groups together so we can monitor developing progress. Pastoral care is also provided through a year-based system. This combination of house and year relationships offer a wide range of friendship groups, opportunities for responsibility and academic and pastoral support.

We believe that a confident grasp of subject knowledge is best acquired through the development of **positive attitudes** to learning and the growth of TENSILE skills which enable our young people not only to succeed at school but also in their future lives.

Students are supported by all staff in the school. This includes our Year Leaders and a Student Support and Wellbeing Hub who are available throughout the school day for students who may need extra support and guidance.
