		If other cases are detected at school, the local health protection team from Public Health England will be in touch to advise on appropriate action, such as asking more people to self-isolate.
		An internal track and trace system is in place in school. Detailing the dates that individual students are self-isolating from and expected date of return. All isolating students are marked with a X code students that return to school after testing are still marked as X until they have spoken to a senior member of staff.

		The amount of shared resources will be limited. Students will have their own stationery and sharing of stationery and other equipment will not be allowed. Spare stationary will be made freely available to students during tutor time. Disadvantaged students receive equipment to free stationary and equipment.
		Toilet use is limited to break and lunchtime where students have designated areas and toilets within these areas. Where students

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		must to go to the toilet, for medical reasons, students use the nearest toilet and have a medical card to allow to them to do this.
		We will follow the government guidance/requirements for use of staff rooms and offices. All offices have a limit on the number of people allowed in at any one time. Staff rooms have been arranged with social distancing in mind – furniture has been removed and stored elsewhere.

		Fire, first aid and emergency procedures will be reviewed to make sure they can still be followed with changes to how the school space is being used.
		Areas in use will be well ventilated by opening windows or using ventilation units. Doors will be propped open, where fire safety and safeguarding won't be compromised. In the event of having to evacuate the building, the member of staff will instruct students to leave the room safely, maintaining social distancing where practicable. The member of staff will leave last, close the window and kick the door prop away allowing the door to close.
		We have adapted the inclusion room, theatre and the support for learning areas to separate bubbles where mixed bubbles would have normally worked. Separating bubbles for small group intervention is not always possible and some cross-bubble interventions take place; where cross bubble work occurs social distancing between different bubbles is in place. The library is currently closed.
		The use of lifts will be avoided unless essential.
		Bins will be provided in classrooms and other key locations to dispose of tissues and any other waste.

		Where possible, all meetings will be conducted by telephone or using video conferencing. This includes meetings with parents, visitors and governors.
		Where this isn't possible, essential meetings will be in a room large enough to allow for social distancing.
