#### Homework – Shenley Brook End School

All students are expected to do homework in accordance with the published timetable gradually increasing during a student's time in school. Not all homework is written; it may involve reading, watching a TV programme, learning, individual research and/or revision, making a model or attending an extra-curricular sports club.<sup>1</sup> The task selected by the subject teacher will be appropriate to the ability of the students. Below is a table illustrating the types and common methods used to assess homework, which are frequently used:
