Apprenticeships are growing in popularity amongst or Sixth Form and Year 11 students as a pathway option to continue their education and training. They are available at all levels including degree level.

This pathway option provides students with an opportunity to gain an academic qualification combined with work experience and a salary and are available in sectors such as Engineering, Law, Business and Finance, Childcare, Health and Beauty, Electrician, Software Development and Nursing to name but a few!

As a school we work closely with local businesses to help raise awareness of career pathways in and around our local area and actively promote apprenticeship opportunities amongst our students.

Level 2 and 3 Apprenticeship Opportunities



Solicitor

We are delighted to place the role of Solicitor in the careers spotlight!

Solicitors provide advice to clients regarding the law and act on their behalf in legal matters.

This is a graduate profession and students can either proceed to University or undertake a degree level apprenticeship.

There are no set requirements for A Level study, however, students should consider studying their strongest subjects at A Level as entry to University is competitive.

Although students can study Law at University, other courses can also be studied from a variety of options from the Humanities to the Sciences and students can undertake post-graduate study in the form of a Law conversion course.

There are currently 425 Solicitors in the Milton Keynes area and the average salary for a solicitor in the United Kingdom is £42,494.
