

# **Careers & Work Related Learning News**

### **Events**

It has been a busy half term at school with students across a range of year groups involved in Careers and Work Related Learning events.

#### Network Rail Engineers of Tomorrow – Year 8 and Year 9

On the 6 November, Engineers and current Apprentices from Network Rail visited school to host a day of activities related to Engineering for a group of Year 8 and Year 9 students. Students worked in groups to design and create their own rail crossings, which they all found hugely enjoyable. Network Rail staff selected a winning group who subsequently visited Network Rail head office to take part in a finals day against other secondary schools from Milton Keynes.

#### Pro Active Speed-Interviewing – Year 10

All Year 10 students attended a speed-interviewing event on the 7 November where they had the opportunity to meet with local employers to learn not only about career opportunities within Milton Keynes but to develop their professional communication skills.

The event was a huge success with one professional remarking:

"At school I was never aware of cyber security consultancy so I was more than happy to join a speed interviewing session to discuss the opportunities in what I think is a very interesting career. Along with 25-30 other professionals, we were gently grilled by some very inquisitive students. I was impressed with the line of questioning, not focusing on pay or travel but really trying to understand what a typical day looks like for me, what skills are needed to perform my job as well as understanding why I enjoyed what I do.

The students were all polite, friendly and a pleasure to talk to; they definitely were model representatives for the school and I would not hesitate in coming back in the future for another speed interviewing session. I think this event is invaluable as it introduces students to new careers they may not be aware of and the potential routes that can be taken to get these careers. I wish there were more events like this when I was at school!"

#### Niftylift Women in Engineering – Year 10

Niftylift hosted an event focusing on encouraging females to consider careers in Engineering at their Milton Keynes site on 14 November. The event provided students with the opportunity to explore these career pathways and discover opportunities in our local area.

#### Public Service Lunch – Year 11

On the 28 November, a group of year 11 students attended a Public Service lunch event at The Hazeley Academy. Professionals from the Army, The Royal Navy, Bucks Fire Service, Thames Valley Police and MK Council attended and provided our students with the opportunity to discover career pathways within the public sector.

#### Business Networking Breakfast – Year 12 and Year 13

Students in Year 12 attended a Business Networking Breakfast on the 5 December where they met with 30 professionals from a range of local businesses including Santander, Barclaycard, Travis

#### Worktree Interview Event – Year 8

All students in Year 8 attended a networking event on the 9 and 10 December where they had the opportunity to meet with professionals from local businesses and discover career pathway information. This experience provided students in Year 8 with an opportunity to begin to raise awareness of career pathways ahead of their GCSE options and emphasise the importance of developing professional communication and networking skills.

#### Law Networking Event – Year 12 and Year 13

On the 17 December professionals from Howes Percival, and Dentons Solicitors visited school to talk to sixth form students who are interested in a career within the legal profession.
