#### **REMOTE LEARNING**

Our remote learning provision on Microsoft Teams continues to be a mix of live lessons and more independent learning through posted resources, pre-recorded videos, quizzes, assignments, online notebooks, virtual eve spv and much more! Each lesson we hope offers a mix of experiences and we encourage our students to interact with teachers and their peers, working in small groups, independently and offline (as we encourage students to have some time away from screens). Students can expect their remote learning on average to take 5 hours daily and look out going forward for more details of our enrichment and extension programme.

#### ATTENDANCE TO LIVE LESSONS

Our expectation is that every student should be attending, and participating in, the following sessions each day:

- Daily registration period with their tutor 9.00am
- Period 1 09.30am
- Period 2 11.30am
- Period 3 1.30pm

Staff are now taking registers in Go4schools to monitor attendance and help us to intervene where engagement is below standard. If you receive a phone call with the **caller ID** blocked, it could be a member of staff, such as a Year Leader or Form Tutor, enquiring about your son/daughter as part of our wellbeing phone calls or enquiring to see how we might be able to further support you in order to improve attendance at live lessons.

Please can you help us by ensuring that your son/daughter attends every live lesson. If this is an issue, then we encourage students to email the teacher in advance and for those really struggling to engage with work please drop the Year Leader an email as we might be able to help.

Parents /carers will also be able to access Go4schools and monitor your son/daughter's attendance to these lessons. If you do, the following coding is used.

- X = student attended the lesson
- XN = student absent from the lesson
- XL = student late to the lesson

Screen time will increase dramatically during lockdown as students look to connect with friends and family but do you know who your son or daughter is messaging on social media during the day or evening? ## **EXAMINATIONS**

We have a number of students that were preparing for external exams at the end of the year. We currently know the GCSE and A level exams are cancelled but we do not know what the plans are for all qualifications yet. We await formal guidance from OfQual and the Department for Education (DfE) about finalised plans for how centre assessment will work this year. Once OfQual have released information for us we will share this information and our response to the guidance with you.

We know that centre assessed grades will be awarded by teachers this year. We will be ensuring that all students are regularly assessed in their lessons before the end of the year in the normal way: homework, assignments on Teams and continuous assessment of class work. It is therefore essential that students continue to engage in lessons and work outside of the classroom.

We hope to run mock examinations in all subjects this year for Years 11 and 13. We expect students to continue to revise and prepare for these exams as our assessment of students will be partially informed by the outcome of these mock exams.
